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Weighing your bales

Minimum bale weight: 120 kgs

Maximum bale weight: 204 kgs

Presenting bales outside this range costs growers money and seriously affects procedures during processing of wool and is against industry standards.

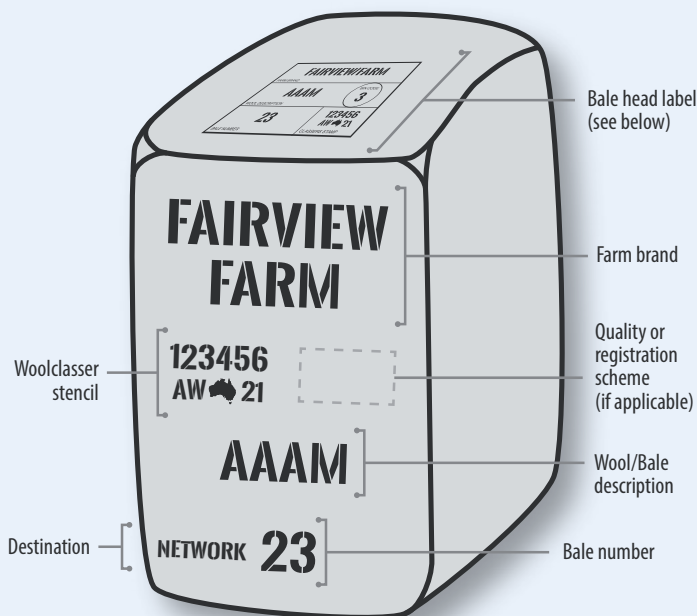
Avoid contamination

- Ensure every bale is completely free of harmful foreign material.
- DO NOT mix different wool types within a bale.
- Ensure correct bale branding.
- Only ever use PAPER as a divider in bales destined for rehandling.

TIPS

- Shake out packs before use
- Do not press wet wool
- Report faulty packs to AWEX
- Use plenty of paper between Bulk Class portions

Maximum bale length = 1.25m

Maximum bale weight = 204kg (including Bulk Class)
